Bishop Conrad De Vito

Bishop Conrad De Vito was born at Provvidenti, a small town in Italy, on the 21st March 1904. He was ordained a priest on the 11th June, 1927. He came to India in 1932, and served as a Chaplain of St. Joseph's College in Nainital. Later he was made the Rector of St. Joseph's Seminary at Allahabad. There after he became the Vicar General of the Diocese of Allahabad. He became the Bishop of the Diocese of Lucknow in 1947. He founded the society of the Maids of the poor in 1951. He was a great visionary and that is why he gave the foremost importance to the establishments of hospitals, schools, old age homes, social service centers etc. He was a man of principles and discipline. He died in Bolongna, Italy on 16 November 1970. To immortalize his vision and mission, the school is named after him as "Child Care"- Bishop Conrad School.

History of School Under the Catholic Diocese of Bareilly



Chid Care Bishop Conrad School Harunagla, Bareilly

The history of the Catholic Diocese of Bareilly goes back to January 1989, when existing as a part of the Diocese of Lucknow, it was separated and made a new Diocese. At present, it includes 9 Districts of U.P. namely Bareilly, Shahjahanpur, Pilibhit, Nainital, Almora, Udham Singh Nagar, Pithoragarh, Champavat and Bageshwar.

This is a registered religious-charitable society, belonging to the Christian minority whose chief objective is to render service to the people through education, health service and social work without discrimination of caste, creed and language. Most Rev. Bishop Ignatius D'Souza, who is the Spiritual Head of the Catholic Community in these 9 districts, is also the President of this Society. Under this parent Society, there is also the Diocese of Bareilly Education Society, a registered body under the chairmanship of Most Rev. Bishop Ignatius D'Souza. The aim of this society is to establish and administer educational institutions under the direction of Article 30 of the constitution, in various parts of the State, to carry on the literacy mission, to impart quality education and value education to make our young students responsible citizens of our country.

There are a number of schools run by this Society, majority of which are Hindi medium in rural areas. They specially take care of the poor children, particularly the girls in interior villages. It takes great efforts to run Non formal Education Centres and Adult Literacy Centres for non school going children.

Bishop Conrad School is a Catholic Christian Minority Institution (Constitution of India Act 30) established and administered by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Bareilly, a Charitable Society (Registered Society) registered in Bareilly on 13.4.1989 under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860.







It is a Senior Secondary School, not under any Govt. Authority, and a separate entity on its own. Children admitted in "Child Care" - Preparatory School do not get automatic admission in Bishop Conrad School, which is run by Catholic Diocese of Bareilly. They will have to seek fresh admission in Bishop Conrad School with proper procedures and admission fee. Four Nuns (Rev. Sisters) belonging to Satya Seva Sisters congregation render their helping hand in the day-to-day administration and academic work of the School.

The students have excellent facilities for sports and games. They participate in various local, state and national level competitions. Beside this, they also take part in Debates, Quiz competitions, Science exhibitions, Cultural Programmes etc. The students being grouped under four houses, hold a number of inter house activities throughout the year.

God has blessed this Institution abundantly and it remains ever grateful to God, to the Catholic Diocese of Bareilly, the Bareilly Education Society, to Bishop Ignatius D'Souza, the President and patron of this Institution and its dedicated Principals, Staff members and well wishers.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVE OF THE SCHOOL

- 1.1 To develop all round personality of a child by inculcating physical fitness, ideals of healthy competitiveness, leadership and self expression, ideals of Indian Culture through games, monitorial systems, dramatics, value education and moral instruction besides catering to the scholastic needs of the students.
 - 1.2 To give importance in all co-curricular activities, to Hindi by cultural activities, debates, etc. and to English through medium of instruction and Examination.
 - 1.3 To endeavor to make school education and activities contributing to Indian Culture.
 - 1.4 To inherit a main stream of national integration through Indian dance and music and to make students scholars, gentlemen and responsible citizens of India.
 - 1.5 To train the mind and shape the character of the younger generation.
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- 1.6 To provide facilities for learning social and other sciences, irrespective of religion, caste and creed.
 - 1.7 To make the students capable of shouldering responsibilities towards God and their country, family and neighbours and their fellow men.
 - 1.8 To teach the technique that will enable them to discover their talents and powers.
 - 1.9 To enable the students to earn their livelihood and become inspiring citizens of the nation and worthy members of the world community.
 - 1.10 To ensure that the product of "Child Care" - Bishop Conrad School be aware of their personal talent and not to use it for their selfish and but for the good of others.
 - 1.11 Punctuality, neatness, uniformity of dress, consideration for others and a co-operative spirit is insisted upon.

ADMISSION



1. Admission to N.C. (L.K.G & U.K.G. if there are vacancies only) classes are usually held in January/February for the following academic year for which application further procedure should be done on the prescribed form before March. Forms are obtainable for a fee in the School Office on a specified date.
2. Children seeking admission in N.C. class should be between 3 years to 4 years on first of April of that academic year. A birth certificate should be produced from the Municipality/ Cantonment Board with the Application form in support of the date of birth entered in the admission form. **Affidavits are not accepted.**
3. There will be verification of forms along with both the parents and the child before the child is selected for admission on a date and time intimated at the time of application form.
4. Admission in any class depends upon the vacancies available and is based on tests in subjects: English, Hindi,

Maths, Science & S.St. in the standard immediately below for which admission is sought and on the interview of both parents and the candidate. The parents and guardians should not put undue pressure on the Principal and the Management for admission through recommendation or through any other source.

5. Proper certificates with the name of the candidate and his/her parents must be submitted along with Photocopies which is duly self-attested by the parents. The parents of students of Class I and above should submit a T.C., countersigned by a competent Education Officer
6. Once selected for admission to any class, the parents should fill in the admission form with utmost care as no subsequent changes will be permitted. The signing of the admission form constitutes an undertaking by the parents that they will abide by the rules governing the school as contained in this prospectus or amended at any time in the future.
No admission forms are issued to anyone to carry home.
7. The condition of admission is that the Parents/Guardians comply strictly with the terms and rules herein stated and pay the admission and composite recurring fees and other charges laid down in the prospectus by due date. **Any future changes made in the prospectus regarding rules or composite recurring fees or any other charges will also be binding on them. The Management reserves the right to admit or refuse admission.**
8. No donation is accepted. Beware of middlemen.

ABSENCE

- 3.1 No leave of absence for the whole day or a part of is granted except on previous written application from parents or guardians and only for serious reasons.
- 3.2 Absence without leave is liable to punishment/fine at the discretion of the Principal. Repeated absence renders the pupil liable to dismissal.
- 3.3 Repeated absence of 3-7 calendar days without notification renders the students liable to dismissal/Re-admission.

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- 3.4 Repeated absence without leave the student on returning to school must have the reasons of absence entered and signed by the parents or guardian on the "leave and absence record". Without this the student will not be admitted to class.
- 3.5 A minimum of 80% attendance of the working days is required for promotion. She/He should come for general assembly in time. **Late comers are liable to be sent home.**
- 3.6 A student who returns to school after a contagious or infectious disease should produce a Doctor's certificate permitting the student to do so (to attend the school).
- 3.7 All are expected to attend school on the reopening day after vacation. Similarly no one is allowed to leave for vacation earlier than the closing day without written permission from the principal.
- 3.8 The school will not arrange any conveyance for the students. The parents/ Guardians are to look into the matter of conveyance. The students are to reach in time for the assembly and leave the school soon, when the classes get over.



WITHDRAWALS

4. A month's notice for withdrawal of ward must be given in writing duly acknowledged by the Principal or a month's fee in lieu thereof.

Those who apply for transfer certificate after re-opening of the school will be required to pay the current month's fee whether the child has attended the school or not. No T.C. will be issued unless all school dues are paid and no-dues Certificate is obtained from the Office.

In case of re-admission, full admission fee should be paid.

Exam Rules

1. The students are liable to be penalised if found doing any unfair work.
2. Assignments are not conducted again if missed.
3. Any student who misses out any semester exam (I or II) will not be considered for any academic award.
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4. During the Half Yearly & Annual Exam students are not allowed to bring any Unwanted material (as per direction).

PROMOTION

5. The students will be promoted to next class on the basis of continuous classroom evaluation, and regularity. KG students promoted to Class I are to seek fresh admission in "Child Care" - Bishop Conrad School, Harunagla, Bareilly, through proper procedures.

FEE

- 6.1 Tuition fee will be charged for all 12 calendar months, other fee as per schedule.
- 6.2 Fees will be collected through Indian Overseas Bank, Stadium Road, Bareilly - 243005.
- 6.3 No school fee will be collected in the school.
- 6.4 No reduction or remission or refund of fee will be claimed on account of holidays or absence of any reasons. No student will be allowed to appear for unit tests until the dues have been paid in full.
- 6.5 No brother-sister concession in fee will be granted.
- 6.6 Late fees will be Rs. 60/- per month including after the expiry of fee due date and subsequent months.
- 6.7 The school reserves the right to increase the fee from the new academic session when considered necessary by the managing committee.
- 6.8 Fee should be paid by the 25th of April, July, October & January. i.e.

- 6.9 Fees accompanied with the Fee Book should be paid in cash at the Indian Overseas Bank, Stadium Road, Bareilly-243005 on any working day from 10.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. Saturdays – 10.00 a.m. to 11.30 p.m.

6.10 No deductions are made for vacations or broken periods.

6.11 All fees must be paid by the due date failing which the pupil's name will be struck off the rolls.

6.12 In case of special circumstances, when parents are unable to pay the fees before the stipulated date, they must see the principal in person and by application seek extension for the same before the due-date in such cases only. A late fee of Rs. 60/- per month is charged.

6.13 Before the withdrawal of pupil a month's fee in lieu of notice is required.

6.14 A fine of Rs. 50/- will be charged if this book is lost.

SCHOOL LIBRARY AND LABORATORIES

7.1 The student may enter the Library and Laboratory during the periods assigned or with the consent of the teacher or the permission of the Principal provided that the **Librarian** and the **Lab assistant** is present. Absolute silence must be maintained in the library as well as laboratory and no books or any material, apparatus or chemical be taken out from there. Every student is allowed to borrow one book per week on his/her library card, other than reference book, after the previous book is returned. Any loss of book issued to the student or damage done in the lab must be made good by the student and if the student is not identified by the class that used the library or the Lab.

CURRICULUM

8.1. "Child Care" - Bishop Conrad School has classes from NC-XII. The school prepares the pupils for All India Secondary School Examination, AISSE - Class X and All India Senior School Certificate Examination AISSCE-Class XII conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

8.2. Examination and its assessment is conducted as per the CBSE guidelines in the school. Classes in Christian doctrine are compulsory for Christian students.

Instruction in Moral and Spiritual Education for all students is also an integral part of the curriculum. Co-scholastic activities, Environmental Education, G.K., Art and Craft, SUPW, Health Education and Computer Education are compulsory in the school.

RULES OF CONDUCT

- 9.1 Every student should bring with him/her daily the school hand book. If a pupil loses the diary, a fine will be levied and a new diary will have to be purchased from the School Office.
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9.2 Care must be taken for all school property **and no student should scratch or spoil/break the desks or chairs or damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belonging to others.** Damage done, even by accident should be reported at once to the appropriate authority. Any damage done will be made good by the offender. Anyone who sees something damaged should report the matter even if he/she does not know who has done it. Each class will be responsible for looking after all class property.

9.3 All should be careful not to litter paper or rubbish anywhere in the school premises. They should use the bins provided for the purpose. **Running, playing or shouting** inside the school building and on the verandah is never permitted.
Students are demanded to speak in English in the school.

9.4 Those who reach before the bell should remain in the class rooms and study silently or meet the teachers concerned for any clarification/explanation. Late-comers will not be permitted to attend the school/liable for enquiry.

No student can leave the school premises during school hours except with the permission of the Principal or Vice Principal with a gate pass. The parents are to collect their wards in emergency cases.



9.5 The school authorities do not hold themselves responsible for the student's loss of money, books, clothes, gold earring etc. Articles found in the school premises are to be handed over to the school office.

PARENT-TEACHER MEETING

10.1 Parent-teacher meeting is held on a **notified day**.

Parents/Guardians are requested to make use of this opportunity to meet the teachers of their wards to discuss the progress of their children.

10.2 The meetings are contact meetings, because the teachers and the parents are all involved in the all round development



of the child. These are occasions for the parents to let the teachers know that they not only pay the fees but also care to appreciate teachers' effort and hard work towards their ward.

- 10.3 As far as possible all are requested to meet the teachers to discuss for anything pertaining to studies should be kept for the P.T. Meet, in emergencies, the Principal's prior permission is required to meet the teachers.

PARTICIPATION

- 11.1 All the students must take part in Games, Physical Exercise and all other school activities. When the students are selected for Programmes in the school, they are to take part in it actively. The parents are to assist by supplying the dress or other materials when asked to do so. All the students are to participate in the class picnics, group photos, National public functions, local or National competitions, whenever the school organizes.

VEHICLES AND CONVEYANCE

12. The school does not arrange any conveyance for the students. The Parents/ Guardians are to arrange conveyance to and fro to school for their wards. The students are to reach school in time for the assembly and leave the school soon when the classes get over. Late comers may be denied entry into the school premises.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS



- 13.1 The main purpose and objectives of this school is to make your child a good, industrious, honest, truthful, just and fair in dealing with all. **Please help us in this great noble task.**
- 13.2 In order to secure all that is best in education of our children the maximum co-operation between parents and the school authorities is desired. Hence, parents/ guardians are expected to co-operate with the school authorities by enforcing regularity and discipline by ensuring that they prepare their lessons daily, come to school in time, wear neat and clean uniform and take an active interest in the





activities of the school.

- 13.3 Occasional report about conduct and application of your children will be send to you by the teachers through the Student Hand Book. We request you to look into this book everyday and assist the school to educate your ward.
- 13.4 When communicating with the principal, parents/ guardians are requested to mention in their letter the name of the student, class and section etc.
- 13.5 No tuition may be taken from any teacher of the school without the prior written permission of the principal.
- 13.6 Parents/ Guardians or any other person are not allowed to see the students or interview their teachers during school hours without the prior permission of the principal. They are requested to come on a notified day for P.T.Meet.
- 13.7 Parents must intimate the school whenever their residential address or telephone numbers are changed in order to communicate to them in urgent matters, in the interest of their children on P. T. Meeting day.
- 13.8 Should there be any infectious disease at your home, please report the fact to the principal at once and do not send your child to the class till the danger is over.
- 13.9 No tiffin, books, medicines or any other articles will be accepted from the parents or others after the school has begun. The students are to bring these by themselves.
- 13.10 In case of sudden leave of a student, the parents are to apply for it in writing **and the children will not be sent along with the strangers or neighbours.**
- 13.11 Students to bring clean drinking water from home and home prepared tiffin daily.
